> **MATERIALS** Toilet paper tube Masking tape Cardboard box **Scissors** Pencil


PROCEDURE


1. Cut one side of the cardboard box.





IT LOOKS LIKE GEORGE IS READY FOR A COSTUME PARTY! HE IS NOT GOING TO A COSTUME PARTY, SCORPY! GEORGE'S HALF-BROTHER, LAWRENCE WASHINGTON, DIED IN 1752. HE WAS AN OFFICER
IN THE MILITIA, AND HIS
POSITION WENT TO GEORGE.
AT ONLY 20 YEARS OLD, HE BECAME MAJOR GEORGE WASHINGTON!

GEORGE WAS SENT TO FREDERICKSBURG, VIRGINIA, IN 1752 TO TRAIN THE MILITIA. IT WAS HERE THAT MANY PEOPLE BEGAN TO NOTICE THAT GEORGE WAS A VERY GOOD MILITARY LEADER! WOW, WHAT COULDN'T HE DO??

IN 1754, GOVERNOR DINWIDDIE OF VIRGINIA SENT GEORGE TO FORT LE BOEUF IN PENNSYLVANIA. FRANCE HAD SENT SOLDIERS THERE TO DEVELOP WESTERN LANDS. MANY OF THE COLONISTS DID NOT LIKE THIS.
