NO, SCORPY, WE 'RE HERE TO STUDY A GREAT WRITER, F. SCOTT FITZGERALD. HE WAS BORN IN 1896 IN ST. PAUL, MINNESOTA. HE WENT TO PRINCETON UNIVERSITY BUT LEFT IN 1917 TO JOIN THE ARMY FOR WORLD WAR I. WHILE IN THE MILITARY, HE MET ZELDA SAYRE, AND THEY MARRIED IN 1920 - THE START OF AMERICA'S "ROARING TWENTIES."


THEY WERE FOR SOME PEOPLE. YOUNG PEOPLE DANCED TO JAZZ MUSIC. LOOK AT THOSE "FLAPPERS" GO!


IN 1925, FITZGERALD WROTE HIS MOST FAMOUS BOOK, "THE GREAT GATSBY:' THIS WAS THE STORY OF AN AMERICAN NAMED JAY GATSBY WHO TRIED TO IMPRESS A LADY WITH HIS NEW WEALTH AND POWER DURING THE JAZZ AGE OF THE 1920 O.


NOT AS MANY AS WE WOULD LIKE. HE DIED at THE EARLY AGE OF 44 . BUT HE LEFT US A VIVID PICTURE OF THE ROARING TWENTIES!


FOR HIS WORK, STEINBECK WON THE PULITZER PRIZE FOR "THE GRAPES OF WRATH" IN 1939. IN 1962 HE ALSO WON THE NOBEL PRIZE FOR LITERATURE.



THIS IS A CONCERT, SCORPY. WE WILL HEAR MUSIC WRITTEN BY THE GREAT AMERICAN COMPOSER AARON COPLAND.

COPLAND WAS BORN IN NEW YORK CITY IN 19OO. HE STUDIED MUSIC IN NEW YORK AND PARIS. HE EXPERIMENTED WITH JAZZ RHYTHMS AND INCORPORATED AMERICAN
FOLK MUSIC INTO HIS STYLE WHEN HE COMPOSED FANCY CONCERT MUSIC.


IN 1945 COPLAND WON THE PULITZER PRIZE FOR MUSIC FOR HIS COMPOSITION "APPALACHIAN SPRING." IN THIS WORK HE USED NATIVE THEMES AND RHYTHMS TO CAPTURE THE FLAVOR OF EARLY AMERICAN LIFE.
